The historic Mormon Tabernacle built in the heart of Salt Lake City is currently undergoing complete renovation. As part of this renovation, Diversified Systems was sole sourced as the sound and video contractor.

The project involves several subsystems including, image magnification, sound reinforcement, distributed sound, house mix, 5.1 Surround Recording Studio, theatre production camera system, broadcast production

Begun in the early 1850s, the complex that includes the Tabernacle symbolizes the strong cultural and religious individuality of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormons). The Tabernacle's unsupported domed roof is one of the largest in the world.

Special care was taken during the installation phase of the project to assure that no damage or change was made to the building structure.
